My eyes were glued. What I was watching was so powerful that I found myself attentively taking in every word that was being spoken.

George Otis, Jr., the narrator for the video entitled "Transformations," was saying, "***True spiritual revival is like a seething lava flow.*** It takes time to reach its destination. But when it does, its intense heat and formidable power alter everything in its path. It is the full measure of God's kingdom come to earth."

He then proceeded to tell his viewers about how God's Holy Spirit is at work in societies all over the world which had been deemed beyond help. Otis shared about *Kiambu, Kenya*, a town which at one time had a horrendous reputation, but through the power of God had been transformed into a desirable neighborhood. Through prayer individuals surrendered their all, asking God to transform them to be holy people. Kiambu became a town where local bars were transformed into churches, where ancestral shrines were destroyed, and where entire family clans were coming to faith in Christ.

After talking about Kiambu, Otis then spoke about what was happening in *Hemet, California*, where gang violence, meth labs, and corruption became things of the past.

Thank You for Giving!

In the final months of 2025, World Missions had some big needs. The Annual Harvest Offering was published to raise funds for exploratory trips for new ministries. In the aftermath of Hurricane Melissa, a request was sent out for relief funds for Jamaica. A family in the Middle East needed an additional \$15,000 in ministry support before the end of the year. The Doyle family in Papua New Guinea needed an additional \$20,000 to support their ministry through their return next summer on furlough.

This sounds like a lot. It **IS** a lot to ask in just two or three short months. But, as we know, "my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:19).

- To date, the Annual Harvest Offering has raised \$14,491 for future trips to new fields. At the time of writing, we are still receiving offerings from churches for this need.
- To date, we have raised \$19,039 for Jamaican hurricane relief.
- The entire need of \$15,000 for the family in the Middle East was pledged.
- The shortfall for the Doyle's support has been met until they come home next June.

Thank you to those who pray regularly for World Missions. Thank you also to those who gave. We are grateful to the Father for supplying these needs.


